It's a good thing that Las Vegas doesn't place odds on the academic success of our residents. They would lose.



Nationwide, 40 of 100 foster youth fail to graduate high school. Only 3 of 100 will earn college degrees.

One of our young women, who preferred not to be named, walked across the stage to collect her Associate Degree from San Jose City College in May. She will pursue a nursing degree in coming months.

A current JP resident, Leslie pictured left, finished course work for her high school diploma in May. Not to be outdone, Mindy, our intern, completed her Psychology degree from Stanford and was graduated last weekend.

The former resident who was mentioned above is very driven in her quest to become a nurse. She overcame enormous, frightening challenges in doing so. A beautiful, intelligent young woman, she was brought to this country from Africa (name of the nation withheld upon her request) and then was abandoned only to end up in foster care shortly thereafter. She spoke very little English when she arrived in the U.S. at age 11, but she persevered, became a citizen, and is focused on reaching her destiny in the medical profession.

We also want to celebrate Leslie, one of our current residents, who earned her diploma after months of hard work, frustration and perseverance. Someone told her she as a child that she did not have what it takes to get through school. She more than proved them wrong. Her next step is Law Enforcement. She wants to serve as a police or probation officer to guide young people past the hurdles of poverty, crime and injustice and toward greater rewards through education and mentoring.

In addition, three residents have completed their senior years of high school and will begin college in the fall. Furthermore, four of our former residents have earned honors this year in their college programs.

About 85 percent of our youth commit to the educational track -- many of them in pursuit of four-year degrees. We are proud of them and are honored to be part of their lives and their success.

And then there is Mindy, our intern who will be very hard to replace. This daughter of missionary parents has served us well administratively and has spent countless hours with our residents to encourage, guide and love them. She will start work at InterVarsity Christian Fellowship upon graduation. We will miss her greatly.

Volunteer Snapshot: Jenny Barnett



Jenny, an LA native who has lived in the South Bay since 2006, first heard about Jeremiah's Promise from a presentation at Highway Community Church. She wanted to be part of the lives of these young women -- to offer them encouragement and guidance as they heal and grow. At the same time, JP needed someone to drive the girls to and from the grocery store, helping them make wise decisions in nutrition and assisting them in staying within their budget. Jenny,

who spent seven years in the Australian Outback with her husband and sons where flexibility and endurance are important qualities, decided to combine both our needs and hers and turned the opportunity into side-by-side coaching as she drove the girls to different errands, including weekly food shopping. This sort of interaction is a nonthreatening way to speak into the lives of our residents, offering wisdom far beyond that of merely deciding between Safeway brand cereal and Special K. It is in these weekly excursions where many topics arise, are discussed and debated and Jenny has the ability to guide the girls toward positive, healthy life choices. Jenny, a physical therapist, recently began tutoring and mentoring one of the young women and has been excited to be part of her growth on a more personal level. Jenny talked about her experience with our residents.

"I want to love the girls for who they are without conditions placed on them," she emphasized. The needs of these girls are complex, and I am only just beginning to understand some of them. Spending time with them on their terms has been the most helpful in separating out what their real needs/desires are compared to what I think their needs/desires should be."

Jenny has proven her ability to listen and understand youth. She and her husband, Daniel, have used the same skills with their sons, Tim, 17, and Kevin, 14. Tim, a recent graduate of King's Academy, is putting off college for a year while he works at a children's mission in Malawi.

As our young women proceed through JP and into the world outside of our home, Jenny will have earned their trust and respect and quite likely will continue to be a listening ear and a warm heart as they navigate bigger choices on their own. This extended network of

support is vital to their continued success.

We are so grateful for volunteers like Jenny who devote their time to really understand the girls and be an ongoing part of their lives.
