Meeting immediate needs is another way we assist youth as they complete high school and advance through college or certificate programs. We have helped many high-achieving youth at transitional housing programs and group homes in the area through clothing and other donations that give them the confidence and basic attire needed to interview for jobs, attend school functions, speak at community events, etc. We expect to support hundreds more in the near future both at transitional housing programs and on college campuses.

Many of our emancipated youth and soon-to-age-out foster youth cringe at the thought of opening themselves to trust yet another adult after having been disappointed so many times in the past. Others relate more to the cyber world and social media than to flesh and blood people. We found a way to mentor youth right where they are at - and wherever they live or hang out.
